

milling sites. The alternative also contains three trash scatters, 11 buildings, and three properties.

4.12.2.15 Alternative H3

Alternative H3 follows Alternative H1 except where Alternative H3 follows La Sierra Avenue north to State Route 91. One unique historic site and 5 prehistoric sites are located along La Sierra Avenue. The “Lake Mathews” quarry site and collection area was identified by the NAHC as a Native American cultural resource. Prehistoric resources within the bandwidth include one lithic/ceramic scatter, 21 milling sites, and one long-term occupation site. The alternative also contains four trash scatters, 10 buildings, and four properties.

4.12.3 Results of Consultations

A records search of the sacred lands file of the NAHC was conducted on October 26, 2001. The NAHC identified 27 potentially interested Native American individuals or groups.
