



SJVAP 3.9 Allow existing agricultural uses within the policy area to continue by right. Transition into conservation uses will only occur by acquisition of property from willing owners.

Airport Influenced Policy Area

The Hemet-Ryan Airport is located within the City of Hemet. In order to provide a safety buffer around the airport, the Federal Aviation Administration and Riverside County impose restrictions on the uses and height of proposed development in the vicinity of the Hemet-Ryan Airport. For more information on the airport and the spaces requiring protection, see the Hemet-Ryan Airport Land Use Plan as well as the County and federal regulations regarding regulation of uses and development standards in airport environs


Policies:



SJVAP 4.1 Enhance the safety of land uses within the Hemet-Ryan environs by adhering to the Airports section of the General Plan Land Use Element, as well as those policies of the Hemet-Ryan Airport Land Use Plan.

SJVAP 4.2 Require property owners within the Airport Influenced area to obtain appropriate aviation approvals consistent with applicable airport regulations and the Hemet-Ryan Land Use Plan.

Specific Plans

 *The authority for preparation of Specific Plans is found in the California Government Code, Sections 65450 through 65457.*

Specific plans are identified in this section as policy areas because detailed study and development direction is provided in each plan. Please refer to Table 3, Adopted Specific Plan in San Jacinto Valley, for specific plan names or numbers that are located in the San Jacinto Valley Area Plan. Policies related to the listed specific plan can be obtained at the Riverside County Planning Department.

Specific plans are highly customized policy or regulatory tools that provide a bridge between the General Plan and individual projects in a more area-specific manner than is possible with community-wide zoning ordinances. The specific plan is a tool that provides land use and development standards that are tailored to respond to special conditions and aspirations unique to the area being proposed for development and conservation. These tools are a means of addressing detailed concerns that conventional zoning cannot accomplish.
