The Coachella Valley Association of Governments is preparing, on behalf of its member agencies, a proposed Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan which is intended to cover 28 species of plants and animals in the Coachella Valley. Currently, this plan proposes to conserve between 200,000 and 250,000 acres of privately owned land through general plan land use designations, zoning/development standards and an aggressive acquisition program for a total conservation area of between 700,000 and 750,000 acres.
